Save Public Education in Baltimore City

Governor Hogan's budget cuts the operating budget of Baltimore City public schools by \$35.5 million or nearly 4%, the largest cut in the state.

What could a cut of \$35.5 million mean?

- 418 teaching positions (city public schools already have the largest on average class sizes in the state)
- 696 educational support staff positions
- \$419 cut in per pupil funding
- \$187,830 cut in funding per school (leading to potentially large cuts in educational programs)

Governor Hogan's budget shows that education is not his priority. We need to respond by saying he can't balance the budget on our backs. Our children's future is too important!
